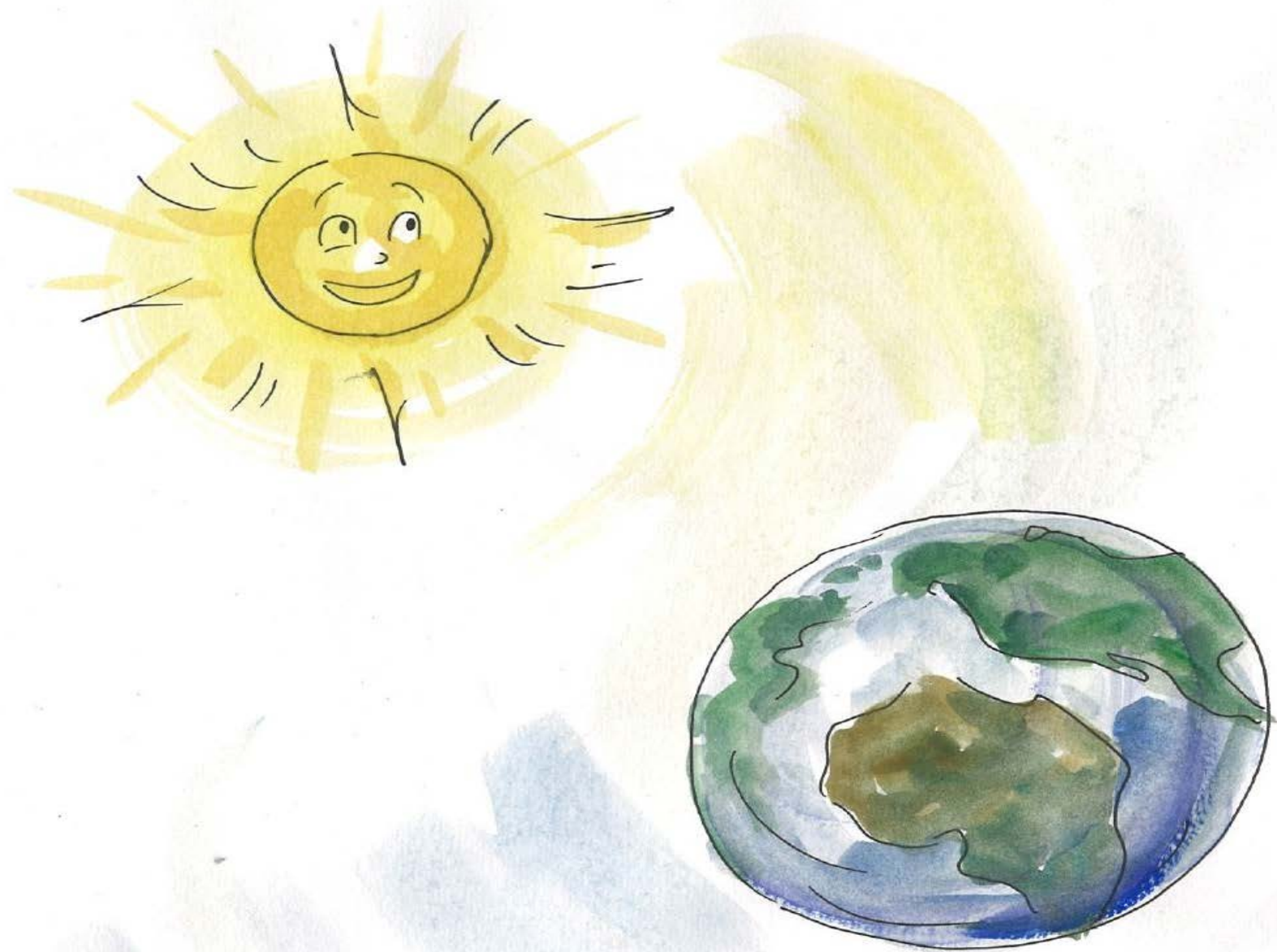

I see the moon and the stars at night, they get light from the sun.



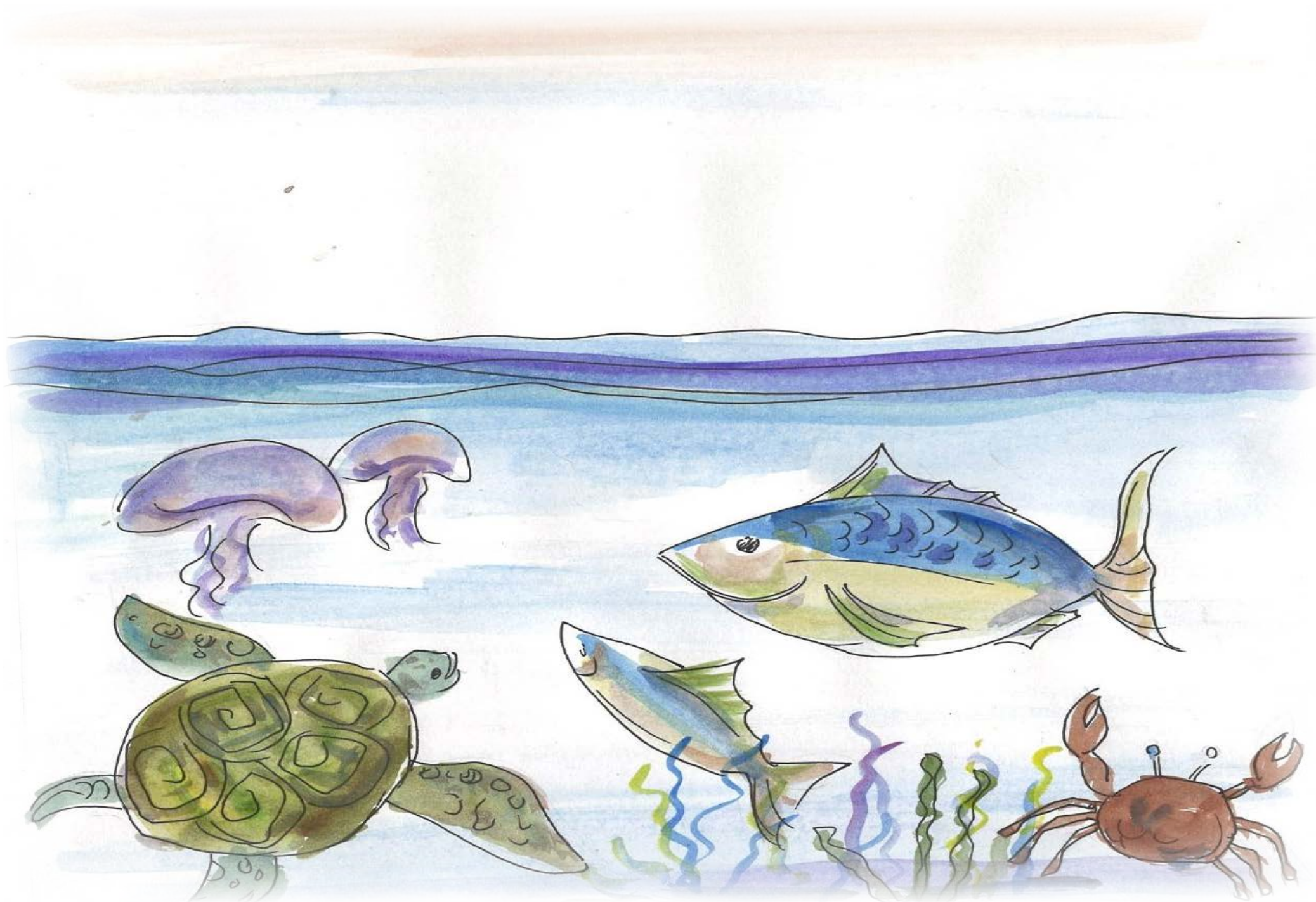
I see the sun, it is big and yellow, it gives light to the earth. Without the sun, there will be no light on earth.
